# Partnership Roles & Responsibilities

Serve as liaison to the Government, identify and secure project sites, provide logistical coordination and community engagement

- **African Diaspora Chamber of Commerce (ADCC)**

Mobilize global expertise, secure international funding, coordinate capacity-building and diaspora engagement, align project goals with diaspora initiatives

- **Petroz Brasil S.A.**

Provide agricultural machinery, technology, and capital, lead sugarcane cultivation and processing, conduct feasibility studies

- **National Black Farmers Association (NBFA)**

Deliver on-the-ground agricultural training and mentoring, facilitate knowledge exchange between African American and Liberian farmers, monitor and evaluate progress



# Agricultural Development Focus Areas



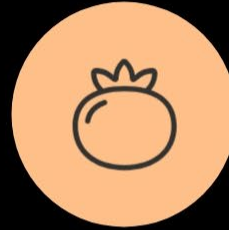
## Sugarcane

# Export and Market Strategy



## Establish reliable off-take agreements

Secure long-term purchase commitments with domestic and international buyers for agricultural commodities like sugar, rice, corn, and tomatoes.



## Partner with export agencies and financial institutions

Collaborate with trade promotion organizations and banks to facilitate financing, logistics, and market access for Liberian exports.



## Create sustainable export channels to regional and global markets

Develop efficient transportation, storage, and distribution networks to deliver Liberian produce to consumers in West Africa, Europe, and beyond.

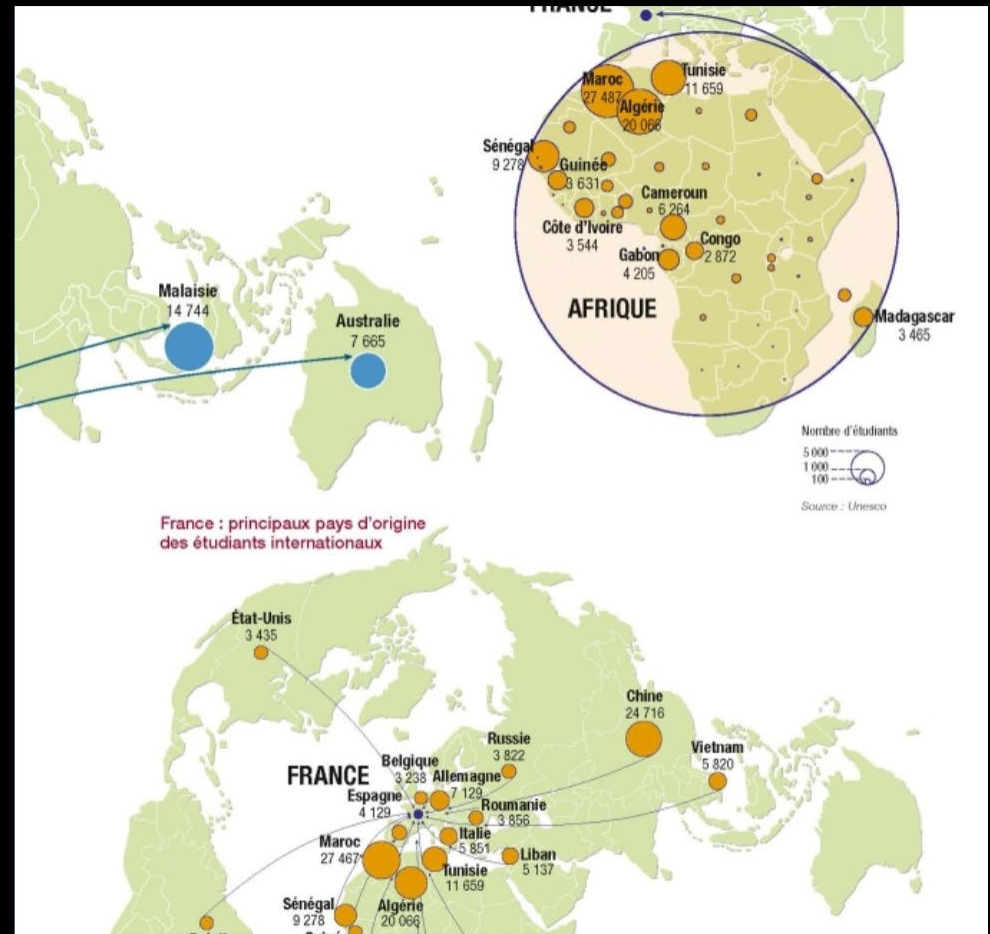
